COVID-19 vaccine programme begins

We all breathed a big sigh of relief when it was announced that the government had authorised the Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for use in the UK, with other vaccines hopefully not far behind. The first Rotherham residents received the vaccine this week and more people will get theirs in the coming weeks and months. We recently undertook a flash survey which showed that **61% of people cannot wait to get the vaccine**, but 34% are still unsure — there are lots of misconceptions and fake news stories about the vaccine, but you can be assured that it is safe and effective. 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A resident contacted us in a bit of a as he had moved accommodation temporary another part of the town, and with everything going on he left it a bit late ordering his repeat prescription for his heart medication. The prescription went to a local chemist in the village where he used to live and the gent had no way of getting there to collect it. We contacted NHS Responders and Rotherham Hub on his behalf but neither were able to assist at such short notice. We called the GP surgery at Braithwell Road in Maltby and the lovely receptionist Tracey worked her magic and the prescription was ready for him to collect 2 hours later from a pharmacy closer to his new place.

A resident contacted us in the summer as she had been waiting for a review of her ADHD medication. She called her mental health team for an update, only to discover that she had been discharged from the service due to a suicide attempt. She had been back to her GP to be referred back into the service but the referral had not been accepted. The resident was due to start university in September and was worried that she would be unable to do this without support. We referred her to Absolute Advocacy for support with raising a complaint and are happy to say she has now received an apology from RDaSH and is back on medication.
