Commitment

- The Steering Group meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 5pm
- There maybe some background reading of papers prior to the meetings. This is an important part of the role to ensure meaningful contribution by all Steering Group members during our meetings.
- Anyone with specialist knowledge may be invited to contribute to provide some support or lead to relevant specific pieces of work. This may include the need for a limited number of meetings outside the Steering Group.
- There may be occasions where you may formally represent Healthwatch Rotherham at a meeting and to support any findings you would be asked to provide a brief written report to the group.

- 5. If your application has been successful, you will be invited to attend the next meeting.
